All about Miami's coolest areas

Coconut Grove

Often simply referred to as 'The Grove', this is Miami's oldest neighborhood. It's known for its tropical greenery, bohemian vibe, and historic charm. Don't miss Peacock Park, which is ideal for picnics, sports, and waterfront views, and check out El Bagel for a bite to eat. Be prepared to queue; the schmears – from scallion to nova to roasted veg – are well worth it.

Sunset Harbour

Located just west of Miami Beach, this up-and-coming neighborhood is packed with boutique fitness studios and cafes – Café Du Bey's Spanish sandwich offering is an exciting new addition to the area. Hit the water at the Sunset Harbour Yacht Club or explore unique stores like Frankie Miami – home to a considered curation of women's fashion.

Mid-Beach

The stretch between South Beach and North Beach is where **Soho Beach House** calls home, alongside some of Miami's most iconic hotels and a buzzing restaurant scene. It also offers a quieter alternative to the bustling South Beach: head out onto the boardwalk to walk, jog or cycle by the ocean, or explore the serene Indian Beach Park.



All about Miami's coolest areas

Design District

The Design District is a creative neighborhood that's known for its designer shopping, upscale galleries and innovative architecture. The area is home to the Institute of Contemporary Art, Galeries Bartoux Miami and The Moore, a historic venue hosting events and exhibitions. After a long day of culture, check out the MIA Market Food Hall for a whole host of chef-driven food vendors.

South of Fifth

Located at the southern tip of Miami Beach, SoFi is renowned for its high-end condos, pristine beaches and impressive dining options, such as the famous Joe's Stone Crab for seafood. The Miami Beach Marina also offers yacht charters, diving expeditions and the perfect spot to catch the sunset as you take in the docked boats in the harbor.



The art to discover in Soho Beach House

The current art collection at Soho Beach House features more than 120 pieces, curated in 2010 by Francesca Gavin. Spread throughout the building, you'll find works by internationally recognized names such as Elizabeth Peyton, Shepard Fairey, Lawrence Weiner and Rashid Johnson, as well as Miami locals including Alvaro Ilizarbe and the duo Friends With You

A unique feature of the Miami art collection is its rotating displays in the club corridor. Intended to introduce members and guests to new artists, the artworks change every 12 weeks and are available for purchase. Special temporary installations are presented during December's annual Art Basel Miami, such as Nina Chanel Abney's technicolor display in 2022 and Harland Miller's historic works in 2023.

1 Dimensions Variable

This nonprofit gallery was founded in 2009 by artists Frances Trombly and Levden Rodriguez-Casanova as an alternative space committed to presenting and supporting contemporary art. With studio spaces and active programming. their model evolves to find what works best for practicing artists. dimensionsvariable.net

2 KDR305

Katia David Rosenthal opened KDR305 in 2021 in a 103-vear-old cottage in Little Havana. She's since moved the gallery to Allapattah and rebranded it as KDR, but the original space still hosts exhibitions. kdr305.com

3 Tunnel

A small project room in a basement parking lot in Little

Havana, Miami, Tunnel was founded and is run by artists. Its unusual location is only amplified by a dynamic program of events and exhibitions. tunnelprojects.com

4 Emerson Dorsch Gallery

Founded in 1991, this gallery has helped shape the city's contemporary art scene. There's an active exchange between emerging and established artists, both local and international which makes each exhibition worth visiting. emersondorsch.com

5 Bakehouse Art Complex

Originally an Art Deco-era industrial bakery, the building was transformed into an artist residency and exhibition space that's been around for nearly four decades.

Eat your way around Soho Beach House

Miami is a feast for all the senses, but don't let your tastebuds miss out on what's on offer at the House.

Our Northern Italian restaurant, Cecconi's, is open to members and the public. Located in the courtyard, it's a sunny spot for an aperitivo, a wood-fired pizza or handmade pasta. On the weekends, the team hosts a Feast, with an unlimited spread of well-loved and new dishes, plus a dedicated seafood station.

The House menu is served in the club space on the second

floor – take your pick from our House Regulars, such as the Dirty Burger, or local dishes based around seasonal ingredients. The snapper, with coconut rice, cherry tomatoes and a hint of citrus is a hit with local members; enjoy it with a House favorite cocktail like Risky Business, with vodka, ume plum, maraschino, rhubarb, and black tea.

Alternatively, you can order healthy snacks, salads and bowls to enjoy while relaxing on the beach, or cool off with poolside popsicles from Ocho up on the rooftop.



The member picks: where to eat and drink Selected by Michael Zaldivar, partner at Milk & Uni and a restaurant strategist

1 Entre Nos

Located in Miami Shores, this restaurant won a Michelin star in spring 2024. A cute coffee shop by day called Tinta y Cafe, it's open for dinner at night as EntreNos with a seasonal a la carte menu that's small but excellent, and lends to the homely feel.

2 ΤΔΜ ΤΔΜ

Chef Tam Pham's small but mighty Vietnamese restaurant is full of character. You can't visit without trying the wings and Jungle Steak Tartare, which pair perfectly with one of the natural wines.

3 Klaw

This Edgewater go-to is located in the historic former Miami Women's Club and is one of my favorite spots for steak. Choose a table in the formal dining room, or – my personal preference – on the waterfront rooftop for great views. Don't miss happy hour, either.

4 Shingo

For fans of omakase, Shingo holds a spot as one of the best dining experiences – and recently won its first Michelin star. The food is matched by thoughtful Japanese design. Plus, it's nice to escape the city by venturing to Coral Gables. shingomiami.com

5 Miami Slice

This place only offers walk-ins, but if you arrive around 5pm you should get lucky. There are five flavors, each served by the slice, so grab a portion of each - from the Margherita De La Casa to the Mushroom Truffle. miamislicepizza.com

1 The Webster

This is my favorite store in Miami. It has the most amazing designer selection, and the space itself is impeccably designed. Each room has a different aesthetic; prepare to spend hours browsing through it all.

2 Eliou

Founded by two Miami-based designers, this store is filled with handcrafted pieces of jewelry made using natural materials, ensuring no two pieces are alike. The pair just launched their new ready to wear pieces, which are like handmade works of art.

3 Big Bang Boutique

This boutique store is located on the third floor of the Faena

Hotel Miami Beach. It has a great selection of pieces from up-and-coming designers, such as JetlagMode and niLuu, as well as artisans from across the world.

Own the night at Soho Beach House

You don't need to head out of **Soho Beach House** to get a taste of the 305's best evening energies. Settle in for a quiet drink or two, or sample some of the lively entertainment on offer.

Check out the weekly Soho Selectors sets, taking place in the Club Bar every Friday and Saturday night from 10pm until 2am. The events shine a light on some of the best of Miami's local musical talent, such as Scollo and Kamari Esson, and as the city is home to an impressive roster of up-andcoming DJs and producers, it's a guaranteed good night.

Throughout the month, you'll also find events such as House Jazz, which is held outdoors in the Beach Bar once a month from 7pm to 10pm. As the sun sets over the city, a mix of local jazz talent and international artists come together to celebrate the flourishing scene.



NIGHTLIFE

The member picks: where to dance the night away Selected by Sven Vogtland, cofounder, 305 Concepts

1 Coyo Taco

Baby Girl is an iconic R&B night that has been running at Coyo Taco every Sunday for six years. It's always fun, with a playlist full of sing-along songs. coyo-taco.com

21-800 Lucky

Humans Alike every Sunday night at 1-800 Lucky is a great house and techno party that has been going for seven years and has some of the best DJs in the world playing at an outdoor venue.

3 Dante's HiFi+

This is a cozy vinyl hi-fi bar with a state-of-the-art sound system. On any given Saturday, you can catch stellar guest DJs, from the likes of Benny Benassi and Louie Vega to Anderson .Paak, who show up to play vinyl-only sets. danteshifi.com

4 The Shrine at Red Rooster

On Saturdays, Walshy Fire from Major Lazer and Dubwise host a night at Red Rooster combing through the sounds of Afrobeats, amapiano and Caribbean culture. This is the real deal and always lots of fun.

5 Jolene Sound Room

Whatever day of the week it is, the DJs playing here are great. The sound system is impressive, and the space is beautiful, too – it's located in the basement of one of the city's most iconic Art Deco buildings.

The member picks: stroll and cycle your way around Miami Selected by Dorian Nicholson, fitness coach

1 South Pointe Park

This park is a must-visit when you're in Miami – great for walking, running, skating, or cycling. From the panoramic views of the Miami skyline to the yachts in the marina, it really gives you that Miami feel. Let's also not forget the amazing sunsets.

2 Oleta River State Park

Kayaking and paddle boarding at Oleta River State Park offers a serene escape into mangrove forests and winding waterways, perfect for nature enthusiasts. The Haulover Sandbar is also nearby – a small sand island where you can grab a drink or a bite to eat.

3 Vizcaya Museum & Gardens

This is a great place to experience Miami's historic

charm, with its Italian-style villa and expansive gardens. Its blend of art, architecture and nature makes it an ideal destination for a walk with plenty of photo opportunities along the way.

4 Shark Valley

Shark Valley has an excellent bike trail. It features a scenic 16-mile loop through the Everglades where you will get the chance to see plenty of alligators, birds, and other wildlife up close.

5 Venetian Pool

The Venetian Pool in Coral Gables offers a unique swimming experience with natural spring water, Venetian-style bridges, and waterfalls. It's the perfect way to cool down on a hot day.



Behind the design of Soho Beach House

Set within a 1940s tower overlooking Miami Beach, the interior design of the House is inspired by the city's Art Deco and Cuban heritage, blending eclectic fabrics and furnishings with light-filled spaces.

At the heart of **Soho Beach House** is the pool with a
bar, where you can relax
on a sunbed. Or, head to
the fully equipped, third-floor
gym, which has a balcony for
training outside, a range of
indoor and outdoor classes,
such as boot camps on the
beach, as well as steam

rooms and a relaxing lounge area. The Cowshed spa is located on the second and third floors, with additional steam rooms, treatment rooms, and six manicure and pedicure chairs, each with ocean views.

The House has 50 bedrooms with antique furnishings and reclaimed fixtures inspired by vintage Cuban designs. There is also a private dining room and a library featuring a wraparound terrace. Further spaces to unwind in include the House's private beach and its ocean-facing rooftop.



The member picks: all of Miami's hottest architecture spots Selected by lan Patrick O'Connor, photographer

1 1111 Lincoln Road

Designed by Swiss architects Herzog & de Meuron, the story goes that the owner of 1111 Lincoln Road wanted to create a private residence, but was denied the opportunity. So, he hired the firm to build a parking garage and penthouse. There are great city views from the top floors, with shops such as the Taschen bookstore.

2 Coral Castle

This castle was built by Edward Leedskalnin between 1923 and 1951. Made entirely of huge coral stones, he would allegedly only work on it at night, never revealing how he moved the stones. Located in Homestead, it's a bit of a drive from the city, but makes a fun day trip.

3 'Slide Mantra' at Bayfront Park

'Slide Mantra' is an interactive art piece by Isamu Noguchi.

It exemplifies the famous sculptor's fascination with the intersection of art, nature and public space, and the spiral form of the slide is inspired by a double helix.

4 Miami Beach Lifeguard Towers

Designed by William Lane after Hurricane Andrew, the City of Miami commissioned 36 towers to run from South Pointe Park to 86th Street. For surfers, they're used to mark the breaks, and locals use them as meeting point references.

5 Pérez Art Museum Miami

Another Herzog & de Meuron design, this museum is located in downtown Miami on the waterfront. Opened in 2013, it features hanging gardens and outdoor spaces. Spend a day checking out the exhibits, then sit on the steps to watch the boats go by.
